*Advocate:* Advance CTE is a leading advocate for <u>policies and legislation</u> that enhance and sustain highquality CTE programs throughout the nation. On behalf of our members and the field, Advance CTE actively monitors federal and state legislative developments, engages key members of Congress, supports and partners with the Congressional CTE Caucuses, and works with relevant federal agencies. Members can also hone their <u>advocacy skills</u> with our extensive resources and supports.

**Provide Quality Professional Learning and Resources:** Advance CTE provides the CTE community with vital tools, resources and technical assistance to support high-quality CTE, including policy briefs, success stories on the ground, and implementation support to the field.
