State Career Technical Education (CTE) systems face the dual challenge of a growing shortage of postsecondary leaders and significant representational diversity gaps, particularly racial diversity. Postsecondary CTE leadership must reflect the 3.5 million learners it serves to ensure each learner has the means to succeed in the career of their choice.

Fellowship Purpose and Structure

Advance CTE and ECMC Foundation's new Fellowship strives to close racial representation gaps and remove equity barriers to career advancement for aspiring leaders historically underrepresented in CTE leadership.

Advance CTE—ECMCF Fellows will gain strategic, equity-minded leadership skills and build networks address systemic inequities and advance high-quality, equitable state postsecondary CTE systems through:

- Interactive, in-depth virtual workshop with

 a curriculum rooted in quality, equity and collaboration
- Individualized coaching
- Organizational convenings and presentations
- Intentional spaces to build relationships with Fellows, national CTE leaders and the <u>ECMCF CTE Leadership</u> <u>Collaborative</u>
- Program stipend
- Completion of real-world fellowship project in their community



2021-2023 Fellowship Cohort

The inaugural 15-member Fellowship cohort (LINK) hails from 12 states, includes 13 professionals of color, and represents multiple dimensions of equity historically underrepresented in CTE, including race and ethnicity, geography, sexual orientation and gender identity. Applications for the second cohort will open in Spring 2022.
