Definition of Advocacy

- Any activity that seeks to influence policies including:
 - -Education
 - -Op-eds
 - –Messaging
 - —Testimony



Definition of Lobbying

 Asking policymakers to take a specific position or to vote on a specific piece of legislation.



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Why is Advocacy Important?

- Education and Awareness You are the expert
- Decision making
- Constituent input
- Many stakeholders not just policy makers
