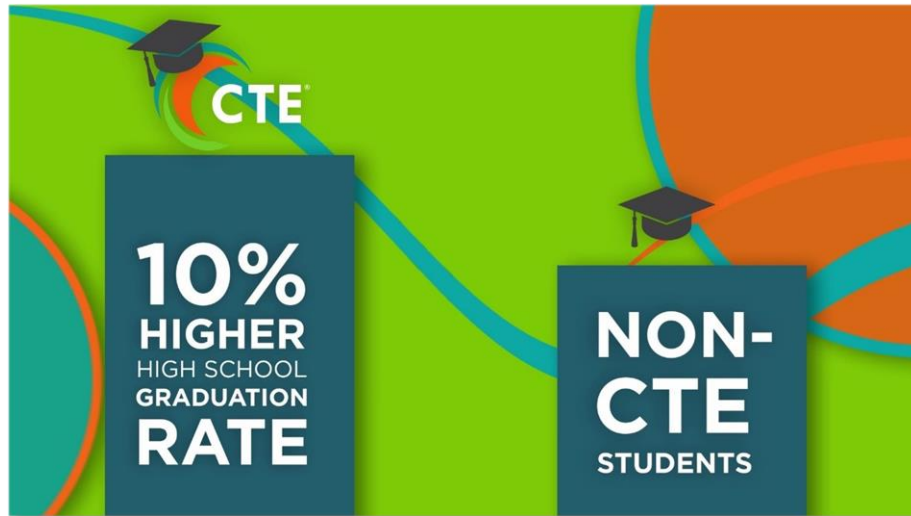


## CTE 101 Video Data



CTE learners are three times more likely than non-CTE learners and their parents to report that they are very satisfied with their ability to learn real world skills as compared to non-CTE learners and their parents.<sup>i</sup>

Over 75% of CTE learners enroll in postsecondary education after high school.<sup>ii</sup>

CTE learners have a graduation rate over 10 percent higher than non-CTE students.<sup>iii</sup>

89% of parents think students should receive more education about career choices while in high school.<sup>iv</sup>

Six of the ten hardest-to-fill positions are in technical fields or require a CTE background.<sup>v</sup>

About half of all CTE learners are enrolled in programs in leading fields such as health care, STEM and information technology.<sup>vi</sup>

More than twice as many CTE parents report being satisfied with internship opportunities for their students.<sup>vii</sup>
