Missouri Career Technical Education (CTE) Statistics At-A-Glance:

Funding:

- Perkins Funds Received in FY10: \$24,871,527ⁱ
- Perkins Funds Received in FY11: \$22,454,564
- Percent change: -9.72%

CTE Student Outcomes Data:

- More than 9 out of 10 adults participating in CTE programs in Missouri earned a certificate, credential, or degree in 2009-2010.
- Most postsecondary CTE students (91%) in Missouri stayed in school in 2009-2010.
- Almost all secondary CTE students (96%) in Missouri graduated high school on time. ⁱⁱ

- Number of Secondary Students Enrolled in CTE in Missouri in 2009-2010: 105,814ⁱⁱⁱ
- Number of Postsecondary Students Enrolled in CTE in Missouri in 2009-2010: 39,499^{iv}

From today through 2018 in MO:

→ *Marketing, Sales, and Services will be the largest Career Cluster overall.*

→ *Information Technology will be the fastest growing, increasing by 16% by 2018.*

→ *41% of all jobs in MO will be found in Marketing, Sales, and Services, Hospitality and Tourism, and Business Management and Administration.*

→ *In MO by 2018, there will be about 321,000 jobs for those with certificates.*
