Nebraska Career Technical Education (CTE) Statistics At-A-Glance:

Funding:

- Perkins Funds Received in FY10: \$7,525,881ⁱ
- Perkins Funds Received in FY11: \$6,816,893
- Percent change: -9.42%

CTE Student Outcomes Data:

- More than 9 out of every 10 CTE students in Nebraska met or exceeded state proficiency levels in math and reading.
- Almost all CTE students in Nebraska completed high school on time.ⁱⁱ
- Nearly all (98%) secondary CTE students in Nebraska were employed, in the military, or in postsecondary education or advanced training six months after graduation in 2009-2010.ⁱⁱⁱ

- Number of Postsecondary Students Enrolled in CTE in Nebraska in 2009-2010: 48,552^v

From today through 2018 in NE:

→ *Marketing, Sales, and Services will be the largest Career Cluster*

→ *Health Science will be the fastest growing Career Cluster, increasing by 19% by 2018.*

→ *In 2018, 40% of all jobs in NE will be found in Business Management and Administration, Marketing, Sales and Services, and Hospitality and Tourism.*

→ *In NE by 2018, there will be 112,000 jobs for those with certificates.*
