New Mexico Career Technical Education (CTE) Statistics At-A-Glance:

Funding:

- Perkins Funds Received in FY10: \$9,279,588ⁱ
- Perkins Funds Received in FY11: \$8,132,919
- Percent change: -12.36%

CTE Student Outcomes Data:

- Almost all postsecondary CTE students (98%) met or exceeded technical skill proficiency levels in 2009-2010.
- About 9 out of every 10 CTE students in New Mexico completed high school on time.ⁱⁱ

CTE Enrollment Data:

- Number of Secondary Students Enrolled in CTE in New Mexico in 2009-2010: 23,564ⁱⁱⁱ
- Number of Postsecondary Students Enrolled in CTE in New Mexico in 2009-2010: 48,031^{iv}

From today through 2018 in NM:

→ *Hospitality and Tourism will be the largest Career Cluster*

→ *Human Services will be the fastest growing Career Cluster.*

→ *In NM in 2018, 42% of all jobs will be found in Business Management and Administration, Marketing, Sales, and Services, and Hospitality and Tourism.*

→ *By 2018, there will be about 98,000 jobs for those in NM with certificates.*
