- Perkins Funds Received in FY10: \$15,361,296ⁱ

- 98% of secondary CTE students in Oregon completed high school on time.ⁱⁱ
- Almost all (95%) of postsecondary CTE students in Oregon met or exceeded technical skill proficiency levels.ⁱⁱⁱ

→ *The Business Management and Administration Career Cluster will be the largest.*

→ *Health Science will be the fastest growing Career Cluster, with jobs increasing by 27% by 2018.*

→ *41% of all jobs in Oregon will be found in Business Management and Administration, Marketing, Sales and Services, and Hospitality and Tourism.*

→ *In Oregon by 2018, there will be about 192,000 jobs for those with certificates.*
