Tennessee Career Technical Education (CTE) Statistics At-A-Glance:

Funding:

- Perkins Funds Received in FY10: \$25,366,106ⁱ
- Perkins Funds Received in FY11: \$23,510,732
- Percent change: -7.31%

CTE Student Outcomes Data:

- CTE students in Tennessee graduated from high school at a higher rate than the statewide rate in 2009-2010 (91% compared to 86.1%)ⁱⁱ
- The majority (90%) of secondary CTE students in Tennessee were employed, in the military, or in postsecondary education or advanced training six months after graduation in 2009-2010ⁱⁱⁱ
- 91% of secondary CTE students in Tennessee graduated high school on time
- Almost all secondary CTE students in Tennessee earned proficient or higher scores on reading (93%) or math (94%) state assessments^{iv}
- Most postsecondary CTE students in Tennessee (91%) were employed, in the military, or in further education or advanced training six months after graduation in 2009-2010^v

- Number of Postsecondary Students Enrolled in CTE: 13,964^{vii}

From today through 2018 in TN:

→ *The Business Management and Administration Career Cluster will be the largest overall.*

→ *Health Science will be the fastest growing Career Cluster, increasing 23% by 2018.*

→ *Marketing, Sales, and Services will add the most jobs in TN through 2018.*

→ *40% of all jobs in TN will be found in Business Management and Administration, Marketing, Sales, and Services, and Hospitality and Tourism.*

→ *In TN by 2018, there will be about 340,000 jobs for those with certificates.*
