Texas Career Technical Education (CTE) Statistics At-A-Glance:

Funding:

- Perkins Funds Received in FY10: \$101,081,082ⁱ
- Perkins Funds Received in FY11: \$89,840,720
- Percent change: -11.12%

CTE Student Outcomes Data:

- CTE students in Texas graduated from high school at a higher rate than the statewide rate in 2009-2010 (94% compared to 84.3%)ⁱⁱ
- 92% of postsecondary CTE students in Texas scored proficient or better on technical skill attainmentⁱⁱⁱ
- 98% of CTE students in Texas earned proficient or higher scores on their state reading/language arts tests, and 94.6% on math tests^{iv}

CTE Enrollment Data:

- Number of Secondary Students Enrolled in CTE in Texas: 943,920^v
- Number of Postsecondary Students Enrolled in CTE in Texas: 310,227^{vi}

CTE: Preparing Texas' Students for Jobs of Today and Jobs of the Future

From today through 2018 in TX:

- The Business Management and Administration Career Cluster will be the largest overall.
- Health Science will be the fastest growing Career Cluster, with jobs in this sector increasing by 32% by 2018.
- Hospitality and Tourism will add the most jobs in Texas through 2018.
- 41% of all jobs in Texas will be found in the Business Management and Administration, Marketing, Sales, and Services, and Hospitality and Tourism Career Clusters.
