Funding:

- Perkins Funds Received in FY10: \$14,197,655ⁱ
- Perkins Funds Received in FY11: \$12,708,187
- Percent change: -10.49%

CTE Student Outcomes Data:

- 97% of secondary CTE students in Utah completed high school on time.ⁱⁱ
- Almost all (97%) of postsecondary CTE students met or exceeded technical skill proficiency levels in 2009-2010.

- Number of Secondary Students Enrolled in CTE in Utah in 2009-2010: 146,253ⁱⁱⁱ

From today through 2018 in UT:

→ *Marketing, Sales, and Services will be the largest Career Cluster.*

→ *Information Technology will be the fastest growing Career Cluster, increasing 37% by 2018.*

→ *By 2018, 41% of all jobs in Utah will be found in Marketing, Sales and Services, Business Management and Administration, and Hospitality and Tourism.*

→ *In UT by 2018, there will be about 164,000 jobs for those with certificates.*
