Statistics At-A-Glance:

CTE Funding:

- Perkins Funds Received in FY10: \$4,452,109ⁱ
- Perkins Funds Received in FY11: \$4,214,921
- Percent change: -5.33%

CTE Student Outcomes Data:

- 94% of postsecondary CTE students in Vermont met or exceeded technical skill proficiency levels.
- Almost all (98%) CTE students in Vermont completed high school on time.ⁱⁱ
- 93% of secondary CTE students in Vermont were employed, in the military, or in postsecondary education or advanced training six months after graduation in 2009-2010.ⁱⁱⁱ

From today through 2018 in VT:

➔ *The Business Management and Administration Career Cluster will be the largest overall.*

➔ *Human Services will be the fastest growing Career Cluster, increasing by 28% by 2018.*

➔ *In 2018, 37% of all jobs in VT will be found in Business Management and Administration, Hospitality and Tourism, and Marketing, Sales, and Services.*

➔ *In VT by 2018, there will be about 33,000 jobs for those with certificates.*
