## Washington Career Technical Education (CTE) Statistics At-A-Glance:

#### **Funding:**

Perkins Funds Received in FY10: \$23,061,524

• Perkins Funds Received in FY11: \$20,600,293

Percent change: -10.67%

#### **CTE Student Outcomes Data:**

- Most secondary CTE students in Washington (88%) graduated high school on time<sup>ii</sup>
- About 9 out of 10 CTE students in Washington scored at proficient or higher levels on their Reading/Language Arts
   Skill Attainment assessments<sup>iii</sup>

#### **CTE Enrollment Data:**

- Number of Secondary Students Enrolled in CTE in Washington: 225,500<sup>iv</sup>
- Number of Postsecondary Students Enrolled in CTE in Washington: 203,807°

# CTE: Preparing Washington's Students for Jobs of Today and Jobs of the Future

From today through 2018 in WA:

- → Business Management and Administration will be the largest Career Cluster
- → Information Technology will be the fastest growing Career Cluster, with a 32% increase in jobs by 2018.
- → Marketing, Sales, and Services will add the most jobs.
- → In 2018, 40% of all jobs in Washington will be in Business Management and Administration, Marketing, Sales, and Services, and Hospitality and Tourism.
- → In Washington by 2018, there will be about 350,000 jobs for those with certificates.
