From today through 2018 in WA:

→ *Business Management and Administration will be the largest Career Cluster*

→ *Information Technology will be the fastest growing Career Cluster, with a 32% increase in jobs by 2018.*

→ *Marketing, Sales, and Services will add the most jobs.*

→ *In 2018, 40% of all jobs in Washington will be in Business Management and Administration, Marketing, Sales, and Services, and Hospitality and Tourism.*

→ *In Washington by 2018, there will be about 350,000 jobs for those with certificates.*
