Wyoming Career Technical Education (CTE) Statistics At-A-Glance:

Funding:

- Perkins Funds Received in FY10: \$4,448,650ⁱ
- Perkins Funds Received in FY11: \$4,214,921
- Percent change: -5.25%

CTE Student Outcomes Data:

- CTE students in Wyoming graduated from high school at a higher rate than the statewide rate in 2008-2009 (94% compared to 80.42%)ⁱⁱ
- 97% of secondary CTE students in Wyoming were employed, in the military, or in postsecondary education or advanced training six months after graduation in 2009-2010ⁱⁱⁱ
- 96% of CTE students in Wyoming completed high school on time^{iv}
- The majority (86%) of postsecondary CTE students in Wyoming persisted at their original institution or transferred to another postsecondary institution^v

- Number of Secondary Students Enrolled in CTE in Wyoming: 7,657^{vi}
- Number of Postsecondary Students Enrolled in CTE in Wyoming: 3,271^{vii}

From today through 2018 in WY:

→ *In WY, the Business Management and Administration Career Cluster will be the largest overall.*

→ *Information Technology will be the fastest growing Career Cluster.*

→ *Architecture and Construction will add the most jobs in WY through 2018.*

→ *39% of all jobs in Wyoming will be found in Business Management and Administration, Hospitality and Tourism, and Architecture and Construction.*

→ *In WY by 2018, there will be about 44,000 jobs for those with certificates.*
