Priority: Develop internal PROCESSES and PROTOCOLS to ensure a strong and sustainable organization

Finance Update: The numbers below represent the FY21 finances for July 1, 2020 through February 28, 2021, which is 67% of the fiscal year. Advance CTE and The Center to Advance CTE are on pace to meet their income projections. Spring Meeting sponsorships and registrations are still going strong. Several budget amendments will be presented to the Board in March to recognize the new grants received.

Membership Update: In February, Advance CTE added four new Associate State members, three new Associate Non-State members, and one new organizational member.

- Individual Associate State: 20

- Organizational: 46 organizations, 173 individual organizational members

Member Engagement & Professional Learning: Advance CTE hosted two members-only Ask an Expert sessions in February. The first, a preview of the new Area Technical Centers research engaged 61 people and included small group discussions. The second was an overview of the State Determined Performance Level changes and 41 people joined.

The early bird registration period for the 2021 Advance CTE Spring Meeting saw 180 people register. The meeting is to be held virtually on April 14 and 15. The sponsorship goal has already been exceeded, with over \$51,000 committed so far. Most speakers have been confirmed and the meeting agenda has been posted to the Spring Meeting [web page here](#).

Advance CTE held another round of regional calls for State CTE Directors, introducing them to the new shared vision for CTE and collecting feedback from this group on planned and desired supports for implementation.

Advance CTE also held one-on-one check in calls with most State Directors this month to capture big-picture highlights from 2020 as well as requests for support and information that would be most helpful in

the year ahead. Trends and highlights will be used to inform the Problems of Practice roundtable discussions at Spring Meeting as well as upcoming Summer Learning Series webinars.

Priority: Ensure the adoption and implementation of high-quality state and federal CTE POLICY.

Federal Advocacy Plan: At the beginning of February, the Senate Committee on Health, Education, Labor and Pensions (HELP) held a hearing on the nomination of Dr. Miguel Cardona to serve as the U.S. Secretary of Education. Ahead of the hearing Advance CTE submitted questions for the Senators to consider asking in order to gauge Dr. Cardona's commitment to high-quality and equitable CTE. These questions were submitted in response to a direct inquiry from a HELP staffer to Advance CTE for CTE and career pathway-related questions. Advance CTE was thrilled to hear Senator Tammy Baldwin (D-WI), a Co-Chair of the Senate CTE Caucus, ask one of the organization's submitted questions. In addition to Senator Baldwin, Senate CTE Caucus Co-Chair Tim Kaine (D-VA) also asked Dr. Cardona a CTE-specific question. The two discussed the importance and value of CTE, and the stigma that needs to be removed. At the hearing Dr. Cardona announced that he is a "proud CTE graduate." Although Dr. Cardona graduated from a CTE program, he does not often include this information in his talking points- so it was significant for him to call this out. Senators Mike Braun (R-IN), Maggie Hassan (D-NH), Mitt Romney (R-UT), Jacky Rosen (D-NV) and Tina Smith (D-MN) all also raised the value of CTE during their statements. Given the limited time each committee member is allotted to make a statement, the attention to CTE was impactful.

This month, House and Senate CTE Caucus Co-Chairs introduced a resolution to recognize February as National CTE Month in each chamber of Congress. Also, in recognition of CTE Month, the Congressional CTE Caucus hosted a briefing for new member offices on "CTE 101." Advance CTE and the Association for Career and Technical Education (ACTE) led this briefing by presenting an overview of CTE, a summary of the Strengthening Career and Technical Education for the 21st Century Act (Perkins V), explaining the role of CTE in economic recovery and answering questions from attendees.

Also in February, Advance CTE signed on to a [letter](#) to leaders of the HELP Committee and House Committee on Education and Labor urging an investment of \$350 million in targeted funding to modernize state and local data systems.

State Policy Update

Year in Review: On February 25, Advance CTE and ACTE released [State Policies Impacting CTE: 2020 Year in Review](#), the eighth annual publication aggregating state level CTE policy actions. A corresponding webinar will take place on March 2, featuring state directors from Indiana and Michigan.

Advancing The Framework: Advance CTE is finalizing the content and design of the Advancing The Framework innovation portal; the first wave of overview content on the portal will launch in early March, and the idea challenge briefs that the CTE community will use to submit responses and innovative ideas related to The Framework will launch in early April. In addition, Advance CTE reached out to a broad group of stakeholders to participate in community and stakeholder engagement sessions to learn more about Advancing The Framework and the innovation portal; these sessions will take place in mid-late March.

Career Readiness Data Quality and Use Policy Benchmark Tool: After 10 months of research and development, guided by the CTE Data Quality Workgroup, Advance CTE released the [data quality policy benchmark tool](#) on February 17. The tool is available on a comprehensive microsite along with six case studies and a repository of state and national resources. Looking ahead, Advance CTE has multiple virtual

learning opportunities planned, including a public webinar on March 4, and will develop a technical assistance strategy to help members implement the tool. As part of this strategy, Advance CTE will develop a facilitation guide for users.

State Technical Assistance:

- **Illinois** continues to receive technical assistance from Advance CTE related to work-based learning and state CTE standards.
- **Iowa:** Advance CTE and ACTE developed an agenda and facilitation guide for the Regional Planning Partnership meetings that will be facilitated, in collaboration with state CTE staff. All RPP meetings will take place in March and April.

Stakeholder Engagement Briefs: Advance CTE is finalizing a set of two briefs that outline strategies states can implement to support ongoing engagement with both business and industry and representatives of special populations. The briefs are undergoing copy edit and will be released in early April.

Guidance on Resetting Perkins V State-determined Performance Levels: In February, Advance CTE and ACTE released a [tool to guide states](#) through the process of revising and resubmitting their state-determined performance levels in response to the pandemic crisis. Additional support is being provided to states through an Ask an Expert webinar (hosted on February 18) and through direct, one-on-one support with states. Advance CTE and ACTE are continuing their conversations with the federal government to clarify the requirements and timeline for this process.

Equity Shared Solutions Workgroup: Advance CTE officially launched our Shared Solutions Workgroup on Leveraging and Elevating the Learner Voice in CTE in February. The group brainstormed strategies for CTE programs to better engage learners. At the next meeting in March the group will decide on the output of the workgroup. In total, there are about 10 national organizations, eight states (Hawaii, Illinois, Minnesota, Montana, Oregon, Washington, West Virginia and Wisconsin) and eight CTE learners participating in this workgroup.

New Skills ready network: Throughout February, Advance CTE conducted virtual site visits with the leadership teams from all six sites. Information learned from the site visits will be used to inform technical assistance and peer learning delivery, sites' development of their next action plans, and the development of year one site snapshots and a cohort-wide annual report that will be released in June. In addition, planning is underway for the second *New Skills ready network* convening that will take place in May.

Postsecondary Data Project: In February, Advance CTE approved action plans and budgets in four of the five grantee sites: Delaware, DC, Florida and Oregon. Year one implementation grants have been disbursed for three with the fourth on the way. To address the needs and priorities of each site, Advance CTE is developing a comprehensive technical assistance plan that will leverage direct, one-on-one supports as well as cohort-based strategies.

Work-Based Learning Report: Advance CTE has finalized the content of the work-based learning report, *Connecting Every Learner: A Framework for States to Increase Access to and Success in Work-Based Learning*. The report is currently in its final design phase and will be released on March 25, 2021.

Aligning Secondary and Postsecondary in Career Pathways Brief: This brief is currently in the first draft stage and highlights both state and local examples from Tennessee, Utah and Ohio of dual enrollment, concurrent enrollment and articulation agreements.

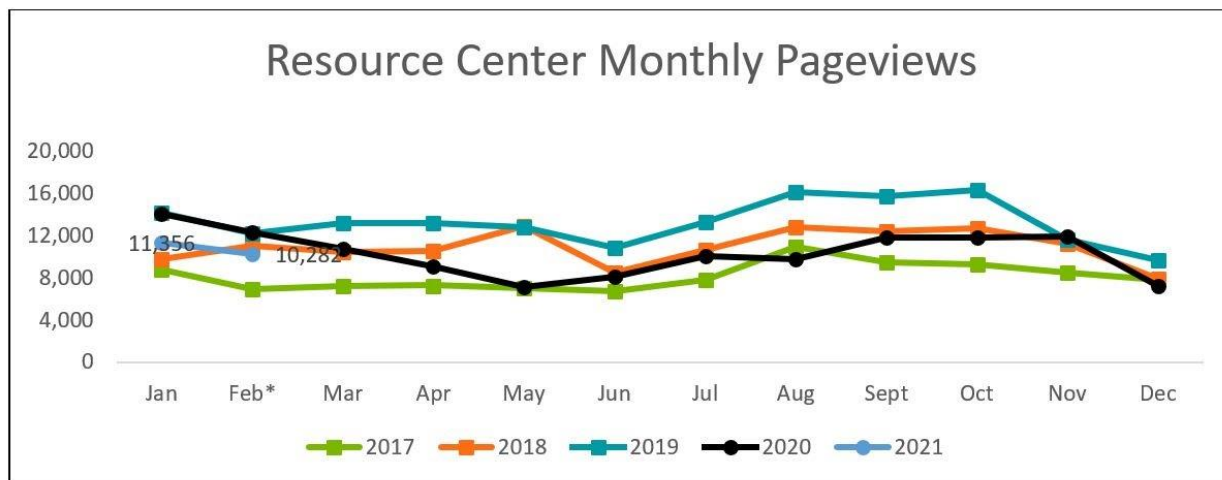
State-Local Partnerships Brief: Currently the brief is in the first draft stage highlighting examples from Hawaii, Colorado and Tennessee. The brief makes mention of several routes to strengthening partnerships

including utilizing employer voice, piloting through local sites and flexibility and trust building. The final brief will be released in mid-May.

PAYA Data Quality Workgroup: In February, Advance CTE and New America kicked off the second phase of the PAYA data quality workgroup. The workgroup will build on last year’s findings by exploring enabling tools and resources to help state and local intermediaries build and sustain a high-quality youth apprenticeship data ecosystem. On the February call, participants provided input into New America’s youth apprenticeship data framework and worked to define the role of intermediaries in supporting youth apprenticeship data.

Area Technical Centers Project: In early February we released the findings of the Lumina-funded project to catalog the nation’s area technical centers (ATCs), determine how states were leveraging these institutions to support postsecondary attainment goals and to highlight best practices in Delaware, Florida, Ohio, Oklahoma and Utah. All created assets can be found at www.areatechnicalcenters.org. This site had nearly 3,000 visits during its first full month of release.

Learning that Works Resource Center: The Resource Center sustained a total of 10,282 hits for the month of February. The top two resources for this month include Advance CTE’s Career Clusters Student Interest Survey, followed by Advance CTE’s The State of Career Technical Education: An Analysis of States’ Perkins V Priorities.

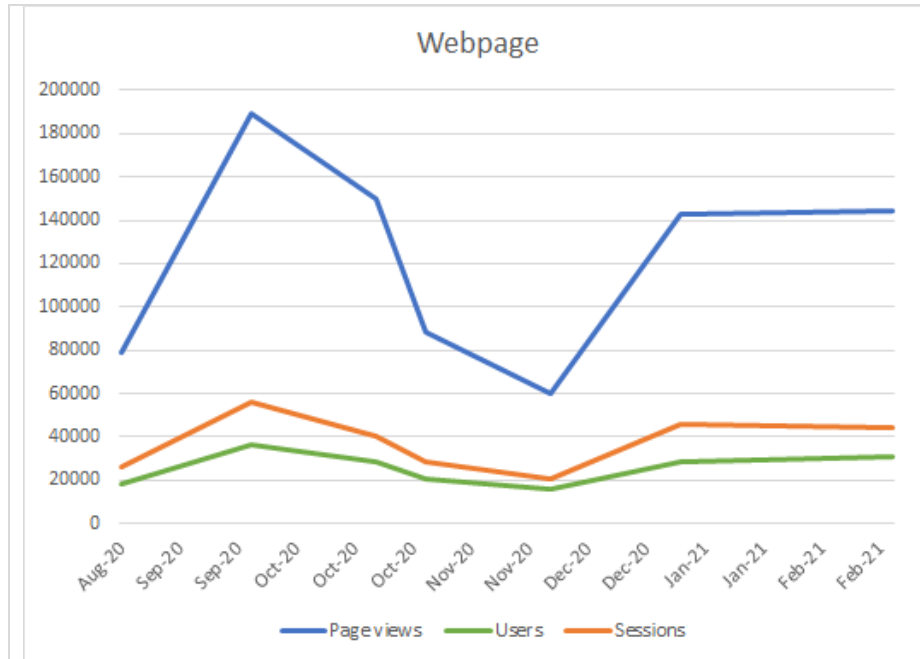

CTE Without Limits: Over February, Advance CTE planned for the release of Without Limits: A Shared Vision for the Future of Career Technical Education including a set of supplemental resources that will be released with the vision on March 11 (promotional toolkit, PowerPoint, talking points, short thought pieces on why key stakeholders should support the vision, a short video etc.). We also have organized release event on March 18, featuring key education and workforce leaders, which nearly 600 people have registered for as of the end of February. We are also working on a robust communications and member support strategy that will take us through the rest of 2021 to ensure our members and partners are positioned and supported to implement key aspects of the vision.

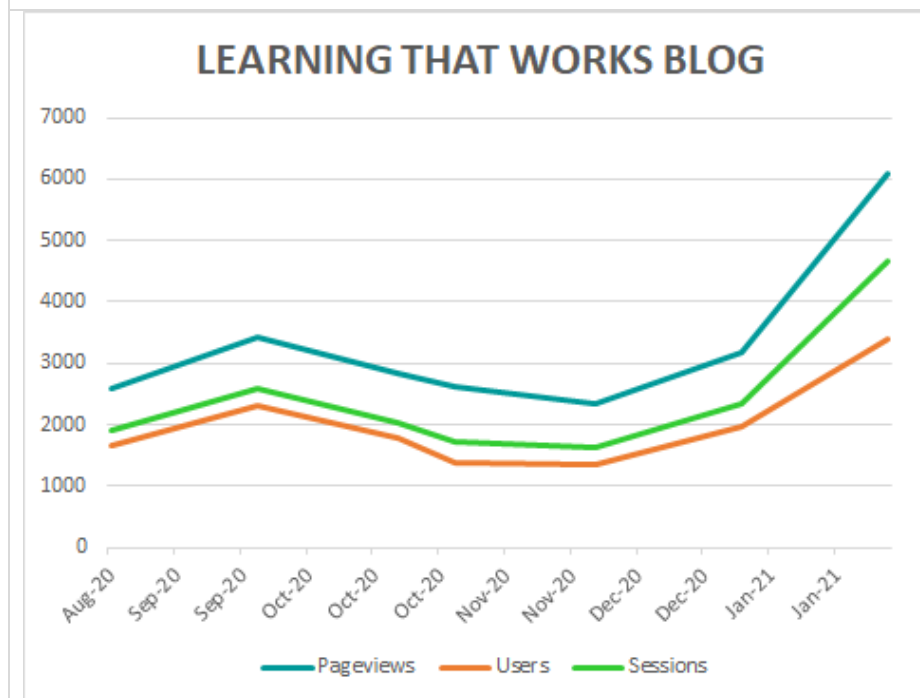

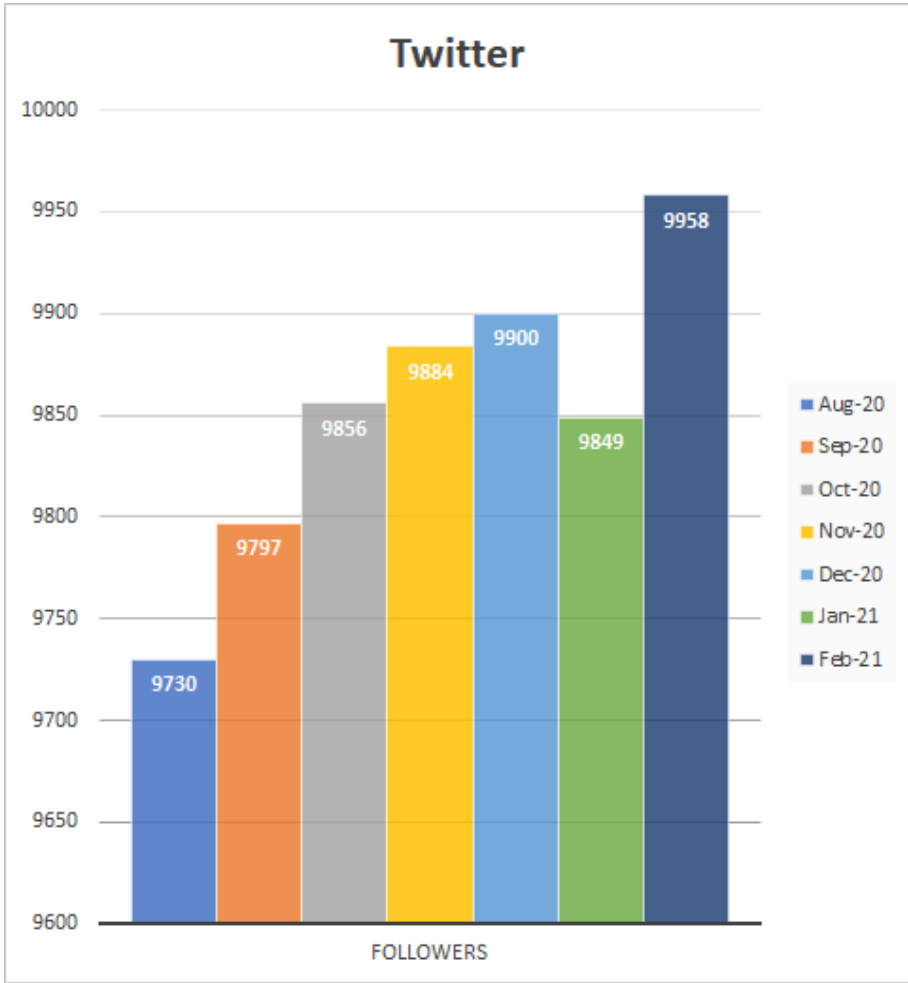

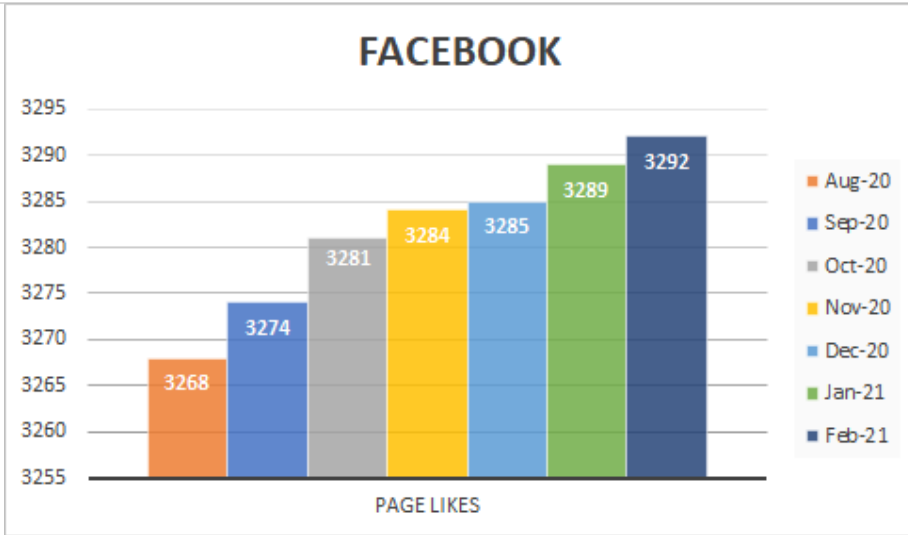

At the beginning of February, the Senate Committee on Health, Education, Labor and Pensions (HELP) held a hearing on the nomination of Dr. Miguel Cardona to serve as the U.S. Secretary of Education. Ahead of the hearing Advance CTE submitted questions for the Senators to consider asking in order to gauge Dr. Cardona's commitment to high-quality and equitable Career Technical Education (CTE). Advance CTE was pleased to hear multiple Senators from both parties bring up the importance of CTE to Dr. Cardona.

For example, Senate CTE Caucus Co-Chairs Tammy Baldwin (D-WI) and Tim Kaine (D-VA) spoke about the value of CTE in the middle grades, secondary and postsecondary education, as well as the need to remove the stigma of CTE. They also mentioned the role that CTE will play in economic recovery. Dr. Cardona voiced his support of CTE and improving access to college and career pathways. He also shared that he is a proud CTE graduate.
