New Vision for CTE

Based on the Future of CTE Summit, Advance CTE will be developing and releasing a new vision for CTE, in collaboration with the Summit co-conveners, that lays an ambitious but attainable vision for CTE. This new vision will be central to Advance CTE's strategic priorities, services and resources over the coming years.



New Skills for Youth

JPMorgan Chase announced a \$75M, 5-year investment in CTE designed to increase the number of young people who complete career pathways beginning in high school and ending with postsecondary degrees or certifications. Advance CTE will co-lead a \$35M state competition to bring together education, business and community leaders to set goals to ensure success in preparing students for high-skill, high-wage careers.



Implementation Support for Federal Policies

With the 2014 passage of the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act and the 2015 passage of the Every Student Succeeds Act, Advance CTE is committed to developing the resources, tools and supports our members and other CTE leaders need to implement these major federal policies in a way that is mutually reinforcing with the Carl D. Perkins Career and Technical Education Act.
