<u>Administrative Updates</u>: Like many across the country, our staff is still under stay-at-home orders and working remotely. Much of the DC metro area is still in phase 1. While we are continuing our planning for what re-entry to the office, we have made the decision to have staff work from home until the end of August 2020. We'll revisit this decision in early August. We have also made the decision to not convene any in-person meetings, working groups, etc. through the end of 2020. We built our proposed FY21 budgets with this assumption.

<u>New staff:</u> We are delighted to welcome Dan Hinderliter to the Advance CTE team. Dan joins us as a Policy Associate, primarily working on the Global Career Readiness Initiative and the Lumina grant. State CTE Directors: There were no new State CTE Directors this month.

Advance CTE held a number of member opportunities this month listed below with their attendance numbers. The learning experiences allowed members to connect and learn from each other, as well as learn from national and state experts on topics including equity, high-quality CTE and credential attainment during Coronavirus. Advance CTE published five blogs directly related to Coronavirus, and a number of others that had some information or resources related to the pandemic and CTE. Advance CTE increased the number of attendees on the organizational Zoom platform given the high demand from Members and the public, highlighting the importance and value of these offerings.

## Priority: Ensure the adoption and implementation of high-quality state and federal CTE POLICY.

<u>Federal Advocacy Plan</u>: In May, Advance CTE continued to represent members' priorities during COVID-19 (Coronavirus) to members of Congress and the U.S. Department of Education. Staff advocated for inclusion of CTE funding and flexibilities in the next stimulus bill, especially through support of the Relaunching America's Workforce Act (RAWA). Advance CTE was disappointed that the Health and Economic Recovery Omnibus Emergency Solution (HEROES) Act- the House Democrat stimulus bill- did not include CTE-specific funding. Advance CTE, in partnership with the Association for Career and Technical Education (ACTE), <u>sent a letter</u> to House Appropriations Committee leadership explaining the importance of CTE funding during the pandemic and for economic recovery. Although the HEROES Act passed in the House, the Senate has voiced that it is unlikely to take the bill up before July. It is also expected that the bill will undergo significant changes in the Senate.

### **Perkins Implementation Strategy**

Shared Solutions Workgroups (SSWG)

The middle grades CTE SSWG is complete and we released the second major deliverable the first week of May – a <u>repository of state-level middle grades CTE resources and tools</u>. We have also kicked off an eight-part <u>blog series</u> featuring promising state and local practices to advance high-quality middle grades CTE in partnership with ACTE.

CTE Data Reporting and Visualization Workgroup: Advance CTE hosted the second workgroup meeting in May with a focused discussion on design principles for CTE data visualization. Based on feedback from the group, Advance CTE and ACTE are now moving forward with the development of two deliverables: a report on CTE reporting design principles and a communications toolkit to help state leaders tell the story behind their data. These deliverables are scheduled for a fall release.

### **State Policy Update:**

CTE Forward Summit: Advance CTE made the decision to transition the CTE Forward Summit to a virtual event, still to be held in mid-September. We are in the process of developing an agenda, including how the event will be structured and over what time period, and plan to open registration in late June. This event will be invite only, with all State CTE Directors invited (along with their counterparts in other state agencies), along with national, state and local leaders identified by Advance CTE and the nine coconvening organizations (ACTE, CCSSO, NASBE, NSC, NCSL, NGA, NASWA, SHEEO and the US Chamber of Commerce Foundation).

Global Career Readiness Initiative: The national project team, which includes Advance CTE and Education Strategy Group (ESG), met with the six project sites in May to kick off the planning phase of the project. In the first phase of the project, sites will complete a robust needs assessment process to identify their strengths and their gaps related to high-quality career pathways. The results of the needs assessment will inform the sites' year-one action plans. Sites will complete the needs assessment process by early September and will finalize their year-one action plans by the end of September.

Advancing The Framework: Advance CTE selected members of the Career Clusters® Kitchen Cabinet; 12 individuals were selected from the 25 states that submitted nominations. Kitchen Cabinet members will share feedback on how their states use Career Clusters and The National Career Clusters® Framework and will provide informal guidance on potential updates to The Framework. In June, Advance CTE will gather input on Career Clusters and The Framework from State CTE Directors and from a small group of postsecondary leaders. Throughout the summer, other members of the CTE community will have opportunities to share their feedback on Career Clusters and The Framework.

CTE Data Quality Policy Benchmark Tool: After a successful workgroup meeting in April, Advance CTE has updated the policy benchmark tool and built out a comprehensive needs assessment using input from workgroup participants. Our plan is to further refine the tool and have a draft ready for piloting later this summer.

ECMCF Postsecondary CTE Data Quality Initiative: After COVID-19 delayed the initial planned launch of the initiative in April, Advance CTE is now prepared to open the application process for the Advancing Postsecondary CTE Data Quality Initiative the first week of June. There have been a few slight modifications to the initiative. State grants have been increased from \$60K to \$80K, and the application process now includes an interview as well as a written application.


Partnership to Advance Youth Apprenticeship (PAYA) Data Workgroup: Advance CTE hosted a peer learning webinar in May featuring state leaders from the Kentucky Department of Education, who shared about the process for collecting data on the Tech Ready Apprentices for Careers in Kentucky program. The next workgroup meeting is planned for mid-June and will focus on the application and use of youth apprenticeship data.

Equity Resources: Advance CTE is partnering with organizations from the Committee on Equity in CTE to develop short resources to help state leaders understand their role in promoting equity and access in Career Technical Education (CTE) for specific populations. Advance CTE is currently partnering with the Council of State Governments (CSG) Justice Center, National Center for Learning Disabilities (NCLD) and the National Center for Homeless Education (NCHE) to develop resources on how to promote access and equity in CTE for juvenile justice involved youth, students with learning disabilities and learners experiencing homelessness, respectively. Advance CTE is in the process of drafting resources with NCLD and NCHE. The resource that Advance CTE developed in partnership with CSG Justice Center is complete. Advance CTE anticipates releasing the resource in early June.

Committee on Equity in CTE: In May, Advance CTE virtually convened the Committee on Equity in CTE to brainstorm ways that state leaders can address any barriers learners may face when trying to access and succeed in high-quality work-based learning experiences during the pandemic.

Learning that Works Resource Center: The Resource Center sustained a total of 6,072 hits for the month of May. The top two resources for this month include Advance CTE's Career Clusters Student Interest Survey, followed by Advance CTE's Broadening the Path: Design Principles for Middle Grades CTE.


Note: Visits to the learning that works resource center have taken a dip in the past few months. We attribute this to two things: first is that website page views trend downward towards the close of the school year. Second, since mid-March, Advance CTE has directed users to the COVID-19 page housing resources related to the pandemic. This redirection may also explain the downward trend. We anticipate numbers to trend upward as we phase out the coronavirus work and begin redirecting traffic to go to the Resource Center.

#### **MAY 2020 COMMUNICATIONS REPORT**







## View from the Hill

Advance CTE continued to work with staff on Capitol Hill and in the U.S. Department of Education to advocate for state CTE leaders' needs during COVID-19 (Coronavirus). When the Health and Economic Recovery Omnibus Emergency Solutions (HEROES) Act was introduced without CTE-specific funding included, Advance CTE in partnership with the Association for Career and Technical Education (ACTE), sent a letter to House Appropriations Committee leadership. The letter details the importance of CTE programs during the pandemic, and the role that CTE plays in economic recovery. The HEROES Act passed in the House, but

has yet to be brought up in the Senate, and Advance CTE keeps advocating for inclusion of CTE funding and flexibilities in the next stimulus bill and we ask for you to join us by letting your representative know that you are in full support of CTE being included in any future relief legislation.

# State Policy Update

On May 8, SB0794 and SB0751 were enacted in Maryland. SB0794 allows county boards of education in specific counties to establish regional CTE schools to provide CTE programs to public high schools in the counties. SB0751 alters the definition of eligible apprentice used for a credit against the state income tax for the employment of eligible apprentices to include individuals employed through youth apprenticeship programs.

### Save the Date for the **2021 Spring Meeting**.



In 1956, Members at the Spring Meeting in Washington, D.C., explored the need for technical careers like laboratory technicians, junior chemists and special industry equipment operators in response to the growing tension between the United States and Soviet Union due to the Space Race.

"This relationship with industry and labor must be maintained. The field of technician is not clearly defined, and there are many levels of technicians. All agencies should be involved in the development of this area of training engineering colleges, junior colleges, area schools, vocational schools and departments."
